PFAS Maximum Contaminant Levels (MCLs)



Federal

- USEPA intends to:
 - Keep MCLs for PFOA and PFOS
 - Extend compliance deadlines for PFOA and PFOS MCLs from 2029 to 2031
 - Rescind MCLs for PFHxS, PFNA, Gen-X, and the Hazard Index concept

Food & Water Watch Inc., et al. v. EPA case

EPA Fluoride Sept. 2024—Federal district court judge ruled that fluoridated drinking water poses unreasonable risk of injury to public health and ordered EPA to act under Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA)

January 2025: EPA filed appeal

April 2025: EPA announced it will assess new information on the potential health risks of fluoridation



July 18, 2025: EPA filed opening brief in appeal

CARB Advanced Clean Fleets Regulation: AB 1594 Requirements



- AB 1594 (Garcia, 2023) requires the California Air Resources Board (CARB) to authorize public agency utilities to purchase replacements for "traditional utility-specialized vehicles" under certain conditions
- Metropolitan met with CARB staff to showcase fleet composition and discuss emergency response concerns for government fleets
 - May 7, 2025 -- virtually
 - June 17, 2025 -- on-site at Weymouth
- CARB released a 45-day comment ACF draft on July 29, 2025
 - Future 15-day change packages may address industry concerns

SWRCB Bay-Delta Plan

State Water Resources Control Board released Revised Draft Sacramento/Delta Bay-Delta Plan Updates

- Staff are reviewing it
- Public hearing –September 8-9, 2025
- Comments due September 10, 2025

SCAQMD: Rule 1171: Solvent Cleaning Operations



South Coast Air Quality Management District amended Rule 1171: Solvent Cleaning Operations

- Regulates the use of cleaning solvents (e.g., liquid denatured alcohol)
- Phases out the use of para-Chlorobenzotrifluoride (pCBtF) and tert-Butyl Acetate (t-BAc) as cleaning solvents
- Metropolitan worked with SCAQMD staff to:
 - Allow the continued use of the liquid denatured alcohol for ozone and chlorine systems
 - Lessen limits on the use of aerosol solvents for general parts cleaning
- Rule goes into effect January 1, 2026
