#### Forest Resilience Bond Pilot Investigations

#### Watershed Agreements

- Three 2-year agreements at a maximum of \$200,000 each in FY's 2024/25 and 2025/26
  - Board approved September 2024
- Metropolitan's leadership played a key role
  - Catalyzed two Forest Resilience Bonds with a third anticipated in 2026
  - Brought in other partners including PG&E & DWR
  - Helped leverage state & federal funding
  - Accelerated work in critical watersheds for the State Water Project


#### **Upper Butte Creek I FRB**

Aquatic species habitat protection

Status: anticipated launch in 2026

**Pilot area:** 1,000-1,500 acres

Scale potential: 20,000 acres



#### **North Feather I FRB**

Post-fire restoration and landscape resilience

Status: launched

Pilot area: 1,500 acres

Scale potential: 167,000 acres

#### **Community Protection I FRB**

Community protection

Status: launched

Pilot area: 5,000 acres

Scale potential: 225,000 acres

#### North Feather I Forest Resilience Bond

Launched: December 2024

Location: Feather River watershed, Plumas NF

**Project Focus:** Wildfire risk reduction, post-fire recovery, community protection




