Current Pending Employment Matters

- Litigation
 - 11 pending cases in litigation
 - Dispositive motions granted in 3 cases in the last 3 months
- Public Employment Relations Board (PERB)
 - 10 active cases

- Hearing Officer Appeals
 - 12 open matters
- Pre-litigation claims
 - 3 open matters
- Negotiations
 - Multiple re-openers in MOU negotiations

Recent Litigation Activity

2021: 4 Pre-litigation Demands

- 2 settled
- 2 filed lawsuits in 2025

2022: 2 lawsuits filed

Both settled

Litigation Activity cont'd.

2023: 7 lawsuits filed

- 4 motions for summary judgment granted
 - 1 appeal filed
 - 1 appeal waived
 - 2 still have time to appeal

3 cases pending

Litigation Activity cont'd.

2024: 2 Civil Rights Department complaints filed

- Both settled
- 1 Pre-litigation demand
- Settled
- 2 lawsuits filed
- Both pending
- 1 Claim
- Pending

2025: 3 lawsuits filed (includes two from 2021 demands)

- All are pending
- 1 Pre-litigation demand
- Pending
- 1 Claim
- Pending

Recap of Recent Completed Employment Cases

Recent Matters Resolved: Reported in General Counsel's Public Monthly/Quarterly Reports, Dec. 2024-Sept. 2025

- Crawford v. Metropolitan Summary judgment granted for Metropolitan, Aug. 2025
- Zarate v. Metropolitan Summary judgment granted for Metropolitan, July 2025
- Lorentzen v. Metropolitan Summary judgment granted for Metropolitan, June 2025; agreement to waive costs and appeal, Aug. 2025
- Tiegs v. Metropolitan Summary judgment granted for Metropolitan, March 2025; appealed, July 2025
- Reese v. Metropolitan Dismissal per resolution within the General Manager/General Counsel Administrative Code authority, Nov. 2024

Resolution of Employment Litigation

Prior Employment Litigation

- Last Employment Trial: 2016
 - All matters since resolved prior to trial by settlement or Summary Judgment Motion
- Last settlement requiring Board approval:
 2009
 - All matters settled since within the authority of the GM/GC

Cost to Resolve Cases Increasing

Outside Counsel Costs

- Firm rates have increased
- Due to internal workload increased reliance on outside counsel
- Cases more complex:
 - Multiple allegations may span decades
 - More discovery/motion work

Actions to Reduce Outside Counsel Costs

Next Steps

- Request one additional attorney: allow more work to be completed in-house.
- RFP for additional employment firms
 - Broaden the pool of employment counsel
 - High quality/reasonable rates
- Review existing firms for cost efficiency
