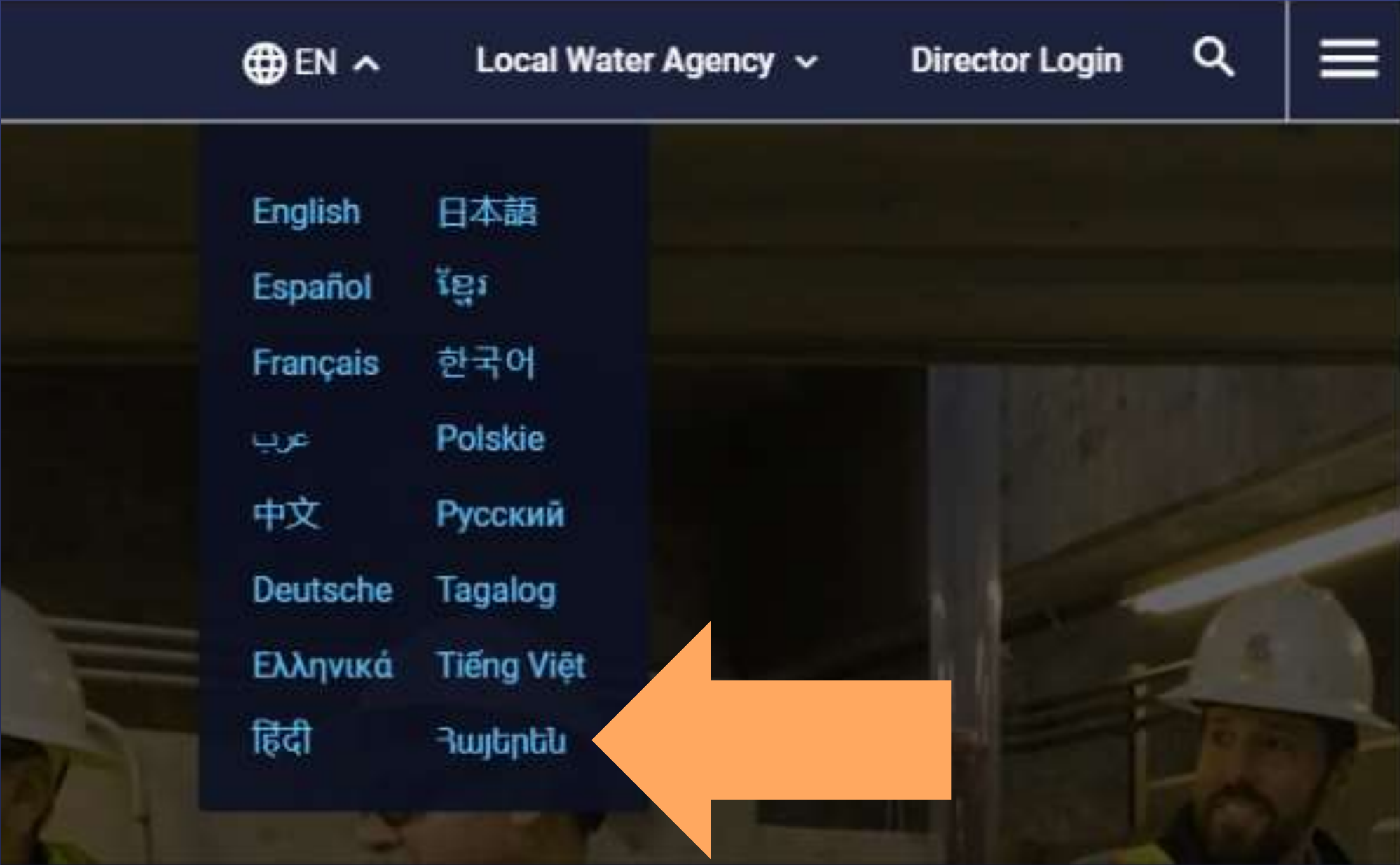

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Accessing Our Board Meetings

The Metropolitan Water District of Southern California encourages members of the public to provide comments to the Board of Directors on matters within its jurisdiction. The district's mission is to provide its service area with adequate and reliable supplies of high-quality water to meet present and future needs in an environmentally and economically responsible way.

Metropolitan is governed by a 38-member board of directors, representing each of the district's 26 member agencies. The board is responsible for establishing and overseeing Metropolitan's policies and programs.

The board meets on the second Tuesday of the month. The standing committees of the board typically meet on the second Monday of the month and on the second and fourth Tuesdays of the month. Standing committees and subcommittees review issues within their areas of responsibility and may make recommendations that are ultimately considered for action by the full board.
