**3. SUBCOMMITTEE ITEMS**

- a.      Subject:              State Water Project California Aqueduct Subsidence Update
- Presented by:       Christopher Martin, State Water Project Executive Policy  
                                         Advisor, California Department of Water Resources (DWR)

Mr. Martin reported on the following:

- Update on State Water Project subsidence impacts, current conditions, and DWR's response strategy.
- DWR reported that interim corrective actions to improve aqueduct conveyance capacity will begin in 2026, with projects continuing through 2029.
- Discussed long-term planning efforts to restore aqueduct capacity and operational flexibility, with construction targeted to begin by 2033.
- DWR continues coordinating with Groundwater Sustainability Agencies and water contractors to address future subsidence and refine long-term solutions.
- Highlighted progress in securing state and federal funding to support interim subsidence repair projects.

- b.      Subject:              Report on the Colorado River Board Meeting
- Presented by:       Director Cordero

Director Cordero provided an update on the San Diego County Water Authority's efforts to expand water-sharing agreements, including a forthcoming memorandum of understanding with the Bureau of Reclamation and Lower Basin partners to explore interstate water transfers. The committee also discussed Six Agency Committee funding, including LADWP's request to temporarily reduce its funding share from 8% to 4%. Members proposed using Colorado River Board reserve funds to cover the one-year funding gap while negotiations continue on a long-term agreement.

- c.       Subject:               Report on the Delta Conveyance Design and Construction Authority Meeting and the Delta Conveyance Finance Authority Meeting.

Presented by:       Director McMillan

Director McMillan provided updates on safety preparations for upcoming geotechnical drilling, approved an amendment for executive strategy support services, and heard that the Delta Stewardship Council returned Department of Water Resources Delta Conveyance Project consistency certification for revisions on two issues before a limited appeal process resumes. The Delta Conveyance Finance Authority approved its FY 2026–27 budget, reported sufficient reserves to avoid a member cash call this year, and directed staff to evaluate winding down the authority beginning next fiscal year. Routine updates were also provided by Delta Conveyance Authority and Delta Conveyance Finance Authority executive staff.

- d.       Subject:               Update on Colorado River negotiations and protection of Metropolitan's Colorado River water rights [Conference with legal counsel – anticipated litigation – deciding whether to initiate litigation; unknown number of potential cases; to be heard in closed session pursuant to Gov. Code Section 54956.9(d)(4)]
