- Ad Hoc Committee on Communications and Facilities Naming to conduct initial review, forward naming recommendations to Legislation and Communications Committee
- Legislation and Communications Committee to consider and forward recommendations to Board for final determination

Update Current Policies

Strengthen Practices, Add New Safeguards

Eligibility of Nominees

- Minimum of one (1) year separation from the Board or Metropolitan employment
- Cannot be actively seeking political office
- Board pre-clearance required before consideration of nominations for living persons

Update Current Policies

Strengthen Practices, Add New Safeguards

Facilities Eligible to be Named

- Existing and new buildings, structures, additions, water infrastructure facilities and systems, roads and significant open spaces owned and operated by Metropolitan
- Certain facilities ineligible due to high visibility, federal or state restrictions, security concerns, or other operational or reputational risks
 - Headquarters Building, Rotunda, Colorado River Aqueduct, Diamond Valley Lake
 - All hydroelectric facilities, pressure control structures, operational control centers, and chemical storage facilities

Update Current Policies

Strengthen Practices, Add New Safeguards

Nomination Requirements

- Application
 - Application form and rationale for naming request
 - Background and information about nominee
 - Minimum of 2 substantive letters of support
 - Other relevant information including Information that might be contrary to this policy
 - Other facilities named or proposed to be named for nominee
- Metropolitan will conduct background and ethics screening of nominees

Update Current Policies

Strengthen Practices, Add New Safeguards

Naming Procedures

- Procedures described for naming, renaming and rescinding a facility name
 - Follow similar procedures with documentation, Ad Hoc committee review, Legislation and Communications Committee review and recommendation to Board
- Metropolitan has sole discretion in whether to name a facility and in the name and facility chosen
- Moratorium on naming proposals until Jan. 1, 2027; resubmit under new policy and procedures

Update Current Policies

Strengthen Practices, Add New Safeguards

Public Input Opportunities

- Member Agencies notified of nominations received
- Proposed nominations announced at Legislation and Communications Committee
- Minimum 60-day public comment period
- Opportunity to provide public comment at committee and board meetings
- Public comment considered in evaluation of nomination and selection of facility

Cost of Naming Activities

Cost Estimates

- Estimate: \$30,000 - \$45,000 per event
 - Staff labor
 - Equipment rentals, food, commemorative plaque
 - Remote locations have higher costs
- Estimate of 2 events per year included in External Affairs O&M budget
