
Envision Silver for Casa Loma Siphon Seismic Upgrade

Developer's Shoring Failure Near Santa Monica Feeder



Location of Failed Shoring

- Developer's contractor placed shoring for construction of underground parking structure parallel to Santa Monica Feeder
- Feeder removed from service on 6/26 upon notification of shoring failure
- Staff coordinating with contractor to stabilize shoring
- Staff conducted initial pipeline inspection on 6/28
- Condition assessment underway
- Developer put on notice



Water System Operations

Managing State Water Project Supplies

- 2025 SWP Allocation at 50%
- CRA at 7 pump flow
- Deliveries to DWCV at 700 cfs
- Deliveries to Cyclic programs
- SWP blend targets are 40% at Weymouth, Diemer, and Skinner
- June 2025 deliveries are trending at 137 TAF, which is 34 TAF higher than June 2024



Member Agency Water Quality Managers Nitrification Workshop




June 26, 2025
