

Adopt Resolution Declaring a Regional Drought Emergency

Water Planning and Stewardship Committee Item 7-8 November 8, 2021

Purpose of Regional Drought Emergency

- Acknowledge drought emergency throughout California
- Call on region to reduce use of State Water Project supplies
 - Preserve limited SWP supply now as rainy season develops
 - Defer to local agencies the amount/types of mandatory actions
 - Work within actions identified in Water Shortage Contingency Plans
- Recognize the varied needs of the region
- Provide the General Manager additional authorities
- Prepare for more action if drought persists

Many targeted drought actions began in January 2021

Began releases from DVL to serve connections on the Lakeview Pipeline



Metropolitan began pump-back operations at Lake Perris to withdraw flexible storage to meet Mills demands



Returns from Semitropic Storage Program and Kern Delta Storage Program began Began operating CRA at full capacity for the first time since 2015



Board voted to explore purchasing transfers north of the Delta

Bulkheads installed to allow deliveries from DVL to Mills Plant

Eastern MWD began shifting deliveries, when possible

Minimize operational flow of SWP to areas that can receive both SWP and CRW

And the drought actions continued through the summer

DVL to Mills Plant in operation for the first time in Metropolitan's history

LADWP began shift through OSCOP

Aug 2021

Began receiving exchange of surface water supplies from the **Arvin-Edison Storage Program**

Continue to discuss **OSCOP** potential with other member agencies

Board declared a Water Supply Alert, calling for consumers and businesses to voluntarily reduce their water use

Sep 2021

TVMWD began shift through OSCOP

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A potential for the drought to continue spurs more action


Resolution to seek grant funds

Board considers droughtrelated actions:

> Initiating design for reliability improvements

Agreements with San Bernardino Valley MWD Wide range of potential actions, depending on water supply conditions.





Resolution calls on Member Agencies to:

- Review past drought response measures
- Adjust operations to reduce use of SWP supplies
- Immediately mandate and implement conservation/water-use efficiency measures to reduce the use of SWP supplies
 - Call for action includes agencies drawing from SWP storage

WP&S Committee Street S

Resolution directs General Manager to:

- Develop unified regional messaging
- Expand regional conservation programs
- Identify and implement measures to ensure all portions of the service area a high level of reliability against multi-year, severe droughts
- Seek state funding to accelerate actions

Resolution provides GM additional authority to:

- Take actions needed to address the regional drought emergency
 - Enhance local water production, recycling, conservation & storage
 - Purchase, transfer or exchange water supplies
 - Procure equipment, materials, services and supplies
 - Provide media buying and placement services for a water awareness and conservation advertising campaign
 - Authority capped at \$5 million/action and total of \$25 million
- Conduct and approve CEQA documentation

Resolution acknowledges uncertainty inherent with precipitation in coming months

- The Regional Drought Emergency and delegated authority sunsets when Governor Newsom's drought state of emergency lifted for all counties in service area
- Affirms that Board would consider further action if drought conditions persist
 - Actions could include declaring a Water Shortage Emergency Condition under California Water Code Section 350 et seq.

Board Options

- Option #1
 - Adopt the proposed Resolution Declaring a Regional Drought Emergency
- Option #2
 - Adopt the proposed Resolution Declaring a Regional Drought Emergency with modifications to the actions called for within the resolution
- Option #3
 - Do not adopt the proposed Resolution Declaring a Regional Drought Emergency.
