Strengthen safety training. Expand security and emergency management capabilities.

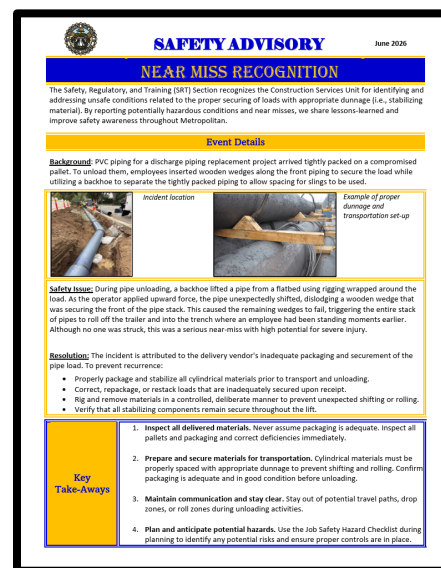
SAFETY, REGULATORY & TRAINING (SRT)

SRT Health and Safety Programs

The Health and Safety Team has issued a new Near Miss Recognition Safety Advisory on Dunnage to Secure Loads, highlighting lessons learned on properly securing loads.

Three Safety Talks, Grief and Loss, Stress in the Workplace, Employee Assistance Program (EAP), and Responding to a Regulatory Agency Visit have been updated to reflect recent changes to the EAP resources.

Lastly, the HSE 101 Injury and Illness Prevention Program and HSE 101.3 Hazard Assessment Procedure have been revised. HSE 101 now incorporates workplace hazards related to COVID-19, and HSE 101.3 includes additional guidance on the Job Safety Hazard Checklist.

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SRT Safety and Technical Training Programs

The Safety and Technical Training Team developed a comprehensive Indoor and Outdoor Heat Illness Prevention training module to strengthen employee awareness of heat-related hazards in all work environments. The training covers recognizing early warning signs, implementing preventive measures, and responding effectively to heat-related illnesses, ensuring all personnel understand their roles in preventing and managing heat stress.

SRT Apprenticeship Programs

The Electrical Class of 2026 began their eighth and final period of apprenticeship instruction, focusing on reviewing previous skills in preparation for the cumulative Demonstrated Proficiency Assessment. The Electrical and Mechanical Class of 2029 completed their joint Period 1 coursework and transitioned into separate trade-specific instruction for Period 2. Meanwhile, the Mechanical Class of 2027 completed their machining midterm examinations, held at Mt. San Antonio College.

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Security Management

Personal Security Awareness Training

Metropolitan Security Specialists conducted an in-person Personal Security Awareness Training for Las Virgenes Municipal Water District Board members and staff based on their combined unique experiences as both retired law enforcement officers and current critical infrastructure protection specialists. The PowerPoint presentation included topics such as:

- Security roles and responsibilities at Metropolitan
- CA Senate Bill 553 Workplace Violence (WPV) Prevention
- Lessons Learned from historical WPV incidents
- Recommended Department of Homeland Security (DHS) response to Active Shooter events – RUN – HIDE– FIGHT
- Expectations of law enforcement response to active shooter events

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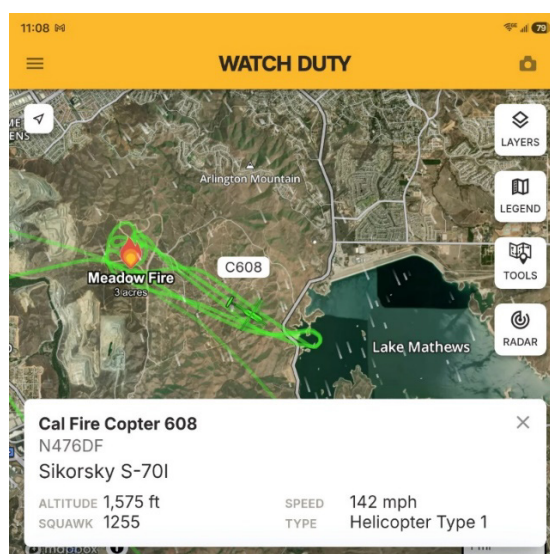
Emergency Management

Multiple Wildfire Responses

Staff monitored seven wildfires during this reporting period that were near Metropolitan facilities or had the potential of impacting employee safety and/or operations. Metropolitan and Department of Water Resources sites were used during some of these fires as water sources to fight the fires. The fires, which were in Los Angeles and Riverside Counties, illustrated an expected increase in wildfire activity this year and may be a precursor to a busy 2026 fire season.

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Preparations and Response to World Cup 2026 Activities

The Metropolitan Emergency Operations Center (EOC) activated, at a low level, to monitor activities in Metropolitan's service area. This included a four-day virtual activation at the end of June to monitor the FIFA Fan Zone Event at Union Station, next door to the Metropolitan's Headquarters building.

The Metropolitan EOC was activated eight times during the 2026 World Cup and communicated with the Los Angeles City and County EOCs to stay updated on World Cup-related events in the County.

These EOC activations give staff the opportunity to test new EOC technology and provide hands-on practice for EOC leadership staff.

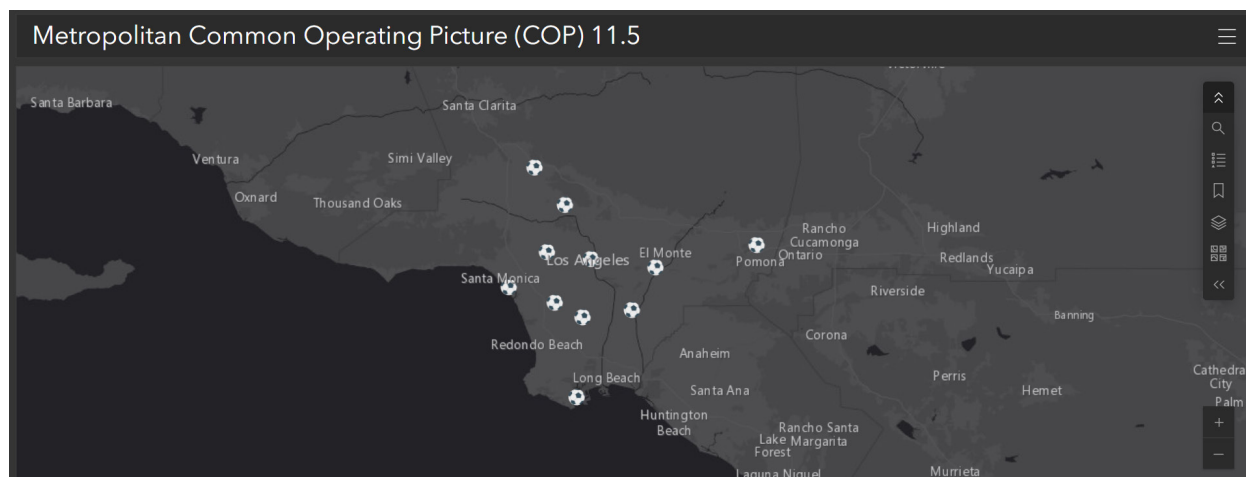


Union Station FIFA Fan Zone

Planning

Staff completed Cal OES-required annual updates for the Live Oak and Cajalco Creek Dam Emergency Action Plans (EAPs) last month. Copies of the updated plans were distributed to all internal and external plan holders.

Preparedness and Outreach

Staff participated in multiple meetings with Union Station Emergency Management and First Responder agencies in preparation for the June 25–28 FIFA Fan Zone Event at Union Station.

Staff also met with Fire Department officials from the Los Angeles County and the US Forest Service during the Zebra Fire in Azusa on July 14. These agencies established a Command Post near Morris Dam, and a Metropolitan Agency Rep responded to confirm dam access and fire status.

FEMA Recovery

Staff dedicated a significant amount of time working with Finance staff to update year-end financial information from past FEMA recovery projects.
